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2025 – 2026 Initiated Programmes

The Vidyarambam Centres for this academic year were launched in the month of June. Across **10 districts**, **26 taluks**, and **166 villages**, the Supplementary Education Centres were initiated. In addition, the Easy English Learning Programme was started in **69 schools**.

Village libraries and a Mobile Toy Library have also been introduced this year in the villages where our centres are functioning.

A total of **23,629 children** have enrolled in the various programmes of Vidyarambam Trust. This year, our programmes are being implemented in **189 Government Schools** across Tamil Nadu.

A **baseline assessment** was conducted for **16,408 children** under the Supplementary Education Programme, and they have been categorized based on their learning levels. Accordingly, **245 dedicated volunteers** are providing training and support to the children based on their learning needs.

Training Sessions

First Term – Training


On **09.06.2025**, an online discussion was held through Google Meet to discuss the first-term curriculum and Lesson plan. The General Manager, Project Director, Coordinators, Assessors, and Office Volunteers participated in this meeting. Since a few chapters in this year's text book have been revised, discussions were held on making the necessary changes to the lesson plan.

SMLC, KIDS, SCJ & SCS – Project Training (Term –I)

From 17.06.2025 to 29.06.2025, first-term training sessions were conducted at the Vidyarambam branch offices in the districts of Tirunelveli, Kanyakumari, Tenkasi, Madurai, Trichy, Dindigul, Ariyalur, Mayiladuthurai, and Chennai.

On the first day, participants were introduced to Vidyarambam's Founder, the late Shri V. Ranganathan, and to the origin and mission of Vidyarambam.

Each training day began with the Tamil Thaaivazhthu, followed by Yoga, Songs, and Seed-sowing activities to symbolically mark a fresh beginning.





Teachers were first trained in the use of Vidyarambam learning materials.

Training was structured as follows:

- **Day 1:** Training for the Kids (3 to 6 years) Learning Centers
- **Day 2:** Training for the SCJ (7 to 8 years) Learning Centers
- **Day 3:** Training for the SCS (9 to 11 years) Learning Centers

In Tirunelveli district, the General Manager addressed the trainers and the trainees via video conference.



ELE – First Term Training

From **26.06.2025** to **08.07.2025**, the first-term ELE (skill-based) training sessions were conducted in the districts of Tirunelveli, Kanyakumari, Tenkasi, Trichy, Dindigul, Ariyalur, Mayiladuthurai, Chengalpattu, and Chennai.

Training was provided on various topics including:

Phonemes, Blending process, Ending words, Homophones, Compound word, Noun – Kinds of noun, Adjectives, Verb, Adverb, Singular and Plural, Pronoun, Articles and Simple tense.

At the end of each day's session, an assessment was conducted for the teachers to evaluate their understanding and skill level.



Toy van - Training

On **24.06.2025** and **25.06.2025**, training on the materials used in the **Mobile Toy Library (Toy Van)** was conducted at the Sankarankovil branch office at around 10:30 a.m. Two trainers and seven volunteers participated in the session. They enthusiastically learned through group play activities.



First Term - Follow up Training

From **30.08.2025** to **01.09.2025**, First Term Follow-up Training sessions for the teachers who are taking classes for Kids, SCJ, SCS and SMLC were conducted in all districts. Madurai Area Tutors joined this session via Google Meet.



Centres Opening

On **23.06.2025**, the ELE and SMLC classes were launched in Sithamalli village, and the first-level assessment was carried out.



From **02.07.2025** until the last week of July, the Kids, SCJ, SCS & SMLC Supplementary Education Centres were inaugurated across the districts of Tirunelveli, Kanyakumari, Tenkasi, Madurai, Trichy, Dindigul, Ariyalur, Mayiladuthurai, Chengalpattu, and Chennai under the guidance of the respective school Heads.





Library Opening

From July onwards, **Libraries** were Launched in all districts. Every Friday, children borrow books, read them, and enjoy the activity.



Pre - Test

During the last two weeks of July, the **baseline assessment** was conducted for the children in the **KIDS, SCJ, SCS & SMLC** Learning Centres across the districts of Tirunelveli, Kanyakumari, Tenkasi, Madurai, Thoothukudi, Trichy, Dindigul, Ariyalur, Mayiladuthurai, and Chengalpattu.



ELE Classes - Opening

From July onwards, **ELE Learning Centres** for students of Classes 6 to 8 began in the districts of Tirunelveli, Kanyakumari, Trichy, Dindigul, Ariyalur, Tenkasi, Mayiladuthurai, Chengalpattu, and for Chennai, 5th to 8th Grades.






LEARNING CENTERS PRE TEST- PERFORMANCE GRAPH

VILLAGE DEVELOPMENT GROUP

Mayiladuthurai District

On **25.07.2025**, a parents' meeting was conducted at **Edamanal Panchayat Union Primary School** in the presence of the Headmistress, Teachers, Parents, Assessors, Centre Teacher, and children. During the meeting, the Headmistress appreciated Vidyarambam, saying:

“The way Vidyarambam teachers conduct classes using learning materials is very helpful for children to easily understand and learn the

lessons. Stories, Songs, Tamil and Mathematics are all taught very well.”



Kanyakumari District

In Kanyakumari district, **Village Development Group (VDG) Meetings** were held on **10.09.2025, 12.09.2025, and 20.09.2025** at the Kulasekarapuram, Thenthamaraikulam, and Eraviputhur centres. **80** participants attended the meeting.



Tirunelveli District

In Tirunelveli district, on **29.08.2025**, VDG meetings were conducted at **Ayarkulam, Kadankulam, and North Vijaya Narayanapuram. 90** participants attended.

The discussions focused on:

- How Vidyarambam was started
- Its purpose
- The various programmes being implemented
- The role played in the progress of the children



Activities

Pre-Primary (KIDS)

- Children narrate **two stories**.
- Teaching aids were effectively used for letters, sounds, and activities.
- Children identify numbers up to **10**.
- They are able to identify the letters up to the mid-level groups of phonemes.



Primary Level – Group 1 (JUNIOR)

English:

- Practiced identifying letters and reading simple words.

Tamil:

- Practiced words beginning and ending with specific letters.
- Children are able to identify letters up to “ஏ”.

Mathematics:

- Numbers, ascending order, descending order, biggest number, smallest number, place value
- Trainers have been instructed to practice **mental math** regularly.



Primary Level – Group 2 (SENIOR)

English:

- Continued practice of letter identification, reading words, and writing small words and simple sentences.

Tamil:

- Practiced multiple words from one word, writing short sentences (using word cards).

Mathematics:

- Numbers, place value, addition
- Taught about **State symbols** and **Planets**.
- Children also practiced combined Tamil letter, place value, and mental math.



VOCATIONAL AWARENESS PROGRAMS

On **21.05.2025**, at our Vidyarambam branch office in **Vijaya Achampadu, Tirunelveli**, **Mr. Kannan Nallathambi** (Electrical Engineer) conducted a training session focused on:

- What electricity is
- How electricity is transmitted
- How electrical circuits work

26 people participated in the training program. He explained everything clearly using demonstration equipment. Teachers from various centres also shared their experiences.

Mr. Kannan continues to motivate trainers by conducting monthly online sessions.



- He sends questions before and asks each trainer to respond.
- After class hours, he also reviews photos posted by teachers and gives corrections.
- He raises questions that encourage trainers to think deeper.



In **July**, children were taught the difference between direct and alternate current and how they function.

They learned how to handle **electrical tools** safely.



In **August and September**, training was given on how electricity used at home works. This was very useful for students doing science experiments.

They also learned the importance of **safety measures**.



In **October and November**, children were taught to differentiate between various **electrical appliances**, including motors, batteries, bulbs, and switches. They learned how electricity passes through objects using **paper, pencil, and magnets**. Through this, they understood how small electrical issues occur and how bulbs are fitted.

Children who were initially afraid of science, gained confidence and performed experiments eagerly.

These programmes help students understand different careers available based on their skills and interests.

Based on these assessments, **LKG** (pre-primary) students were admitted to the school.



June 2, The school reopened for the **academic year 2025–2026**. Students attended with great enthusiasm and excitement.



June 12, The **LKG class** for the academic year **2025–2026** started. Many children entered the classroom crying, unwilling to separate from their parents.

To attract the children's attention, teachers conducted activities such as **action songs, dance, and showed videos**. Several parents stayed with their children inside the classroom to help them settle.



June 21 – International Yoga Day

International Yoga Day was celebrated. Students of Grades 4 and 5 performed yoga in the form of a dance and impressed everyone.



July 1 – Doctors' Day

On Doctors' Day, students from **LKG to Grade 5** dressed up as doctors and other medical professionals.

They enacted skits and gave speeches to explain the importance of healthcare workers to their fellow students.



July 7 – Van Mahotsav (Forest Festival)

To mark Van Mahotsav, students presented skits and speeches on the importance of **trees, forests, and wildlife**, creating awareness among other students.

Mr. **Muthamizh Anandan**, Social Activist, Green Research and Development Foundation, graced the event and distributed prizes to the children.


The smart board helps to:
